





#### 2022: A Year of Change

#### Interior Transformation

What a difference a year can make! In 2022, the Library underwent a complete makeover to modernize the space into an inviting, open concept with new shelving and furniture, comfortable seating areas, collaborative workspaces with a multitude of power outlets to power personal devices, and a coffee and tea cafe suitable for remote working and lounging. The Fiction Room relocated to the forefront to greet patrons as they enter, there is a new space dedicated to teens, and the multi-purpose Schaffner Room was refreshed from top to bottom.

The interior renovations feature purposefully designed and selected wood shelving and furnishings, a serene color palette, updated flooring, new circulation and reference desks, and clear, modern signage. The relocated fiction area is a bright, open-concept space filled with comfortable

seating and workspaces. The non-fiction collection and patron computers moved to the Reading Room, which provides quiet space to work and study. Many individuals and groups take advantage of the new meeting space on the lower level, which can accommodate up to 30 visitors, and offers collaborative workspace. The new café with free coffee, tea, and hot chocolate has proven very popular. Teens love the new young adult area which features stylish "egg chairs," and houses the YA collections, graphic novels, and Nintendo Switch games. Other collections were relocated to improve access and functionality. Every seating area throughout the Library features floor electrical outlets for charging devices. The Library was open throughout the sixweek project, which concluded in December, providing check in/checkout services and inter-library loans. All programs and events took place as scheduled and the Children's Room remained open.





The Schaffner Room, a multi-functional space which serves all ages and hosts a wide range of events and activities, serves a pivotal role in the Library's programming as a gathering space for the community. The new aesthetic is reflected in high-contrast,

monochromatic colors, carpeting, and LED track lighting. An upgrade to motorized shades and custom acoustic wall panels improves the room's form and function. A new state-of-the-art audio system offers an enhanced experience for lectures and multimedia presentations, and enables the Library to offer hybrid in-person and virtual programs. The room features a professional art track display system which offers visitors an inviting space to enjoy the work of local artists. The Pound Ridge Library Foundation generously funded updates to the Schaffner Room, completed in July.

#### **Library Leadership**

In January, the Library appointed a new Director. In September, 14 residents ran for seven open seats on the Library Board and four new Trustees joined the Library Board. The Board also elected a new slate of officers.

#### **Dozens of Programs for All Ages**

Our weekly children's programming includes **musical programs**, **twice-daily all-ages story-time**, **Reading with the Dogs**, **chess**, **STEM programs**, and **art**. Weekly adult Zoom programs like **Tai Chi**, **Modified Yoga**, **Mindful Meditation**, **Writer's Inspiration**, and **Cardio & Strength** are popular and convenient. In-person adult programs like **The Great Courses**, **Mah Jongg**, **Canasta**, and **Yoga** are a great way to meet people who share your interests. Not to mention, our monthly book groups for both adults and children!

#### **Our Special Programs**

The Library held many special workshops and sessions in 2022 from live performances to author visits to educational presentations and visits for children, teens, and adults. These included:

- Lectures like Can Sustainable Food Systems Save the Climate?, Books and Bridles: The Story of the Horseback Librarians, Bird-Friendly Backyards, What is Juneteenth?, Northeast Native American Stories, and If Stone Walls Could Talk
- Workshops and discussions like The Last Slave Ship book discussion, Simple Skills for Watercolor, Earring-making workshop, Home Downsizing in 4 Easy Steps, and Women and Money financial series "How to Make Sense of Today's Financial Market"
- Informational sessions like How to Successfully Navigate College Admissions in 2022, Behind Closed Doors: Shedding the Light on Domestic Violence, and New Local, Heirloom Community Seed Library and "Seed Saving" program
- Activities, visits and performances like the Darien Nature Center animal visit, Children's Summer Reading Game, children's costume swap, Annual Fox Read: Merci Suarez Changes Gears, Dr. Peter Muir piano recital and lecture, and Mommy & Me Yoga


#### The Schaffner Gallery
